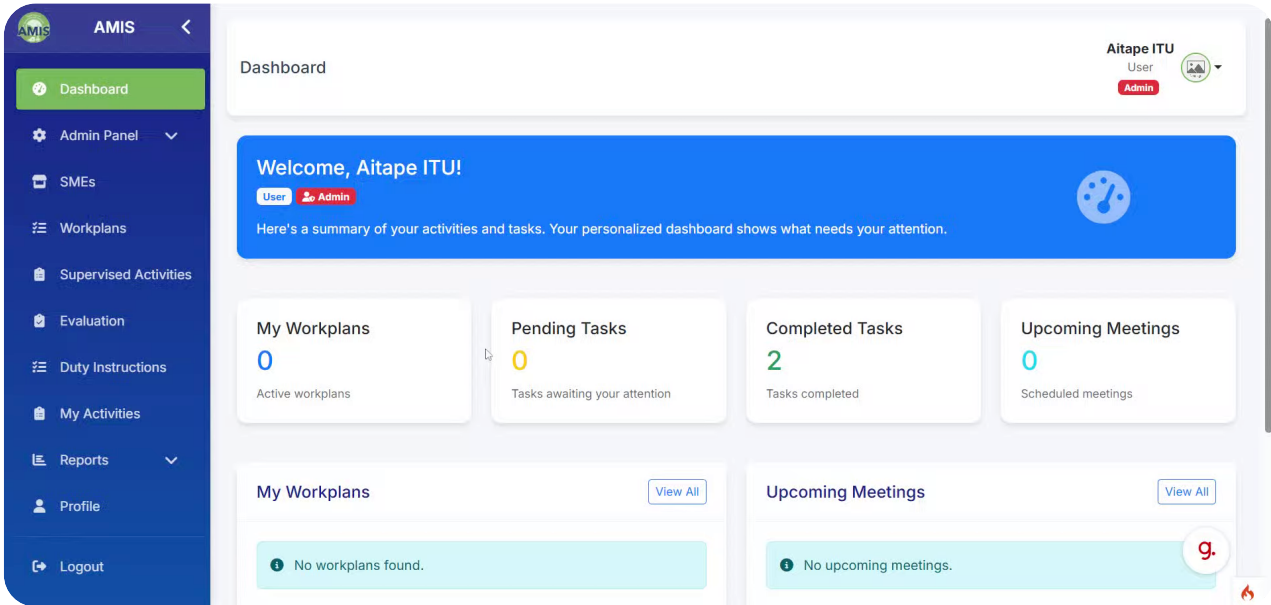


In this tutorial, we are going to learn about how to update your profile in amiss and how to change your password.

Go to localhost

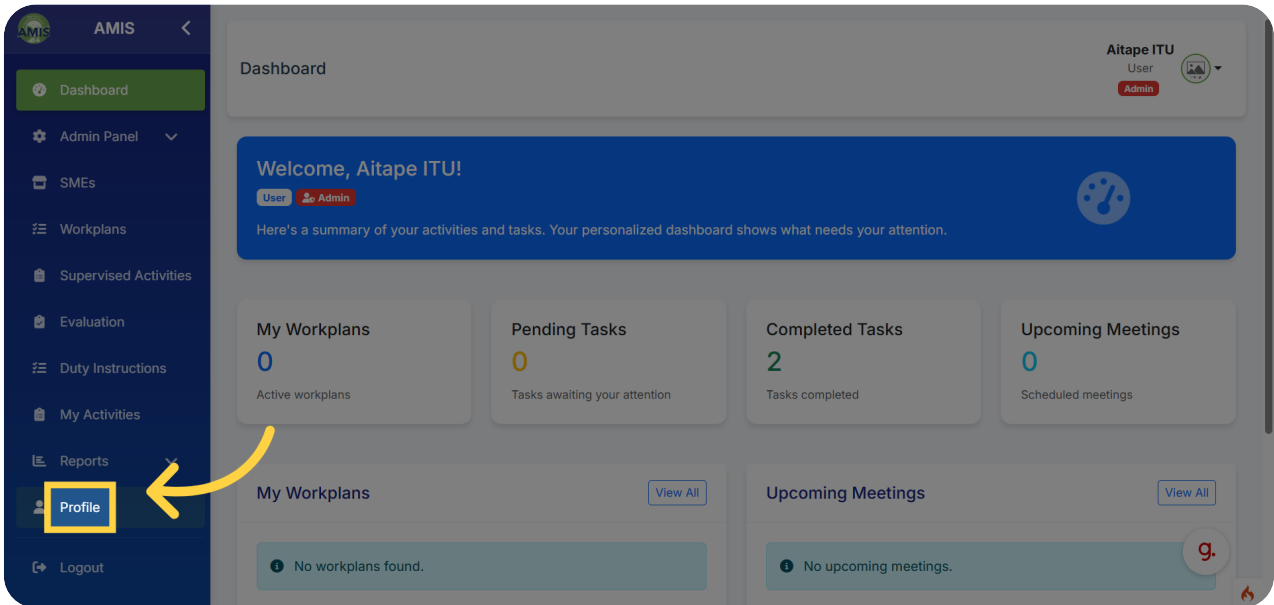
01 Introduction

To access the profile page. You have to log in with your register email in the password.



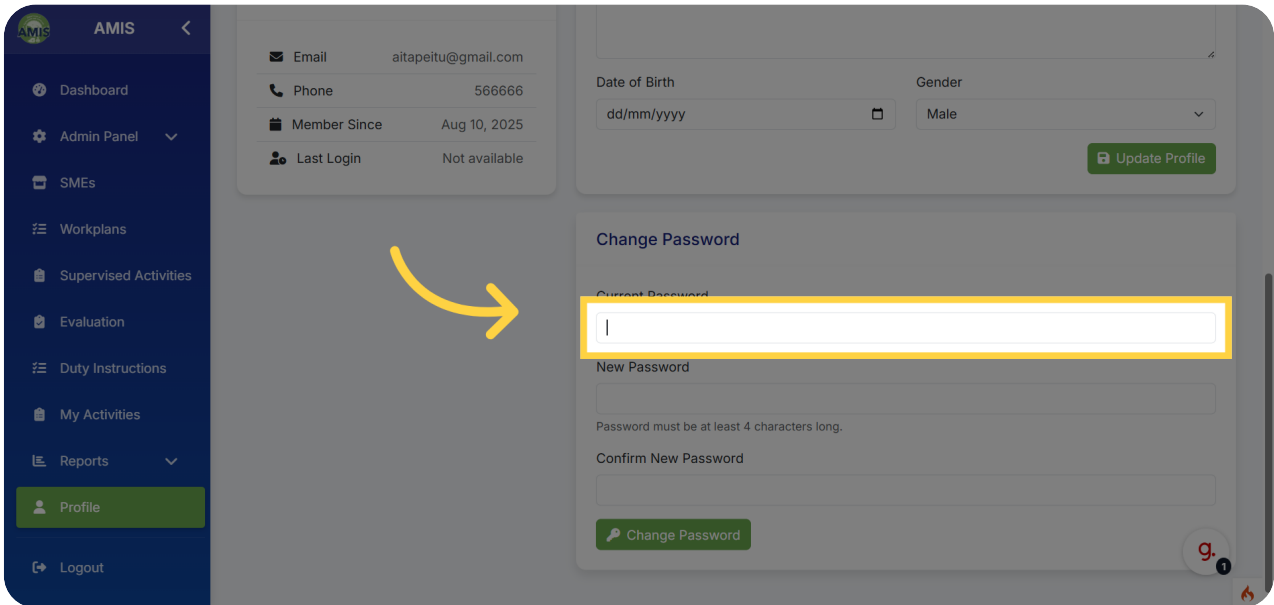
02 Open User Profile

It click on the profile menu. To open your profile page. On your profile page. You can update the profile information.




03 Access Password Settings

04 Select New Password Field

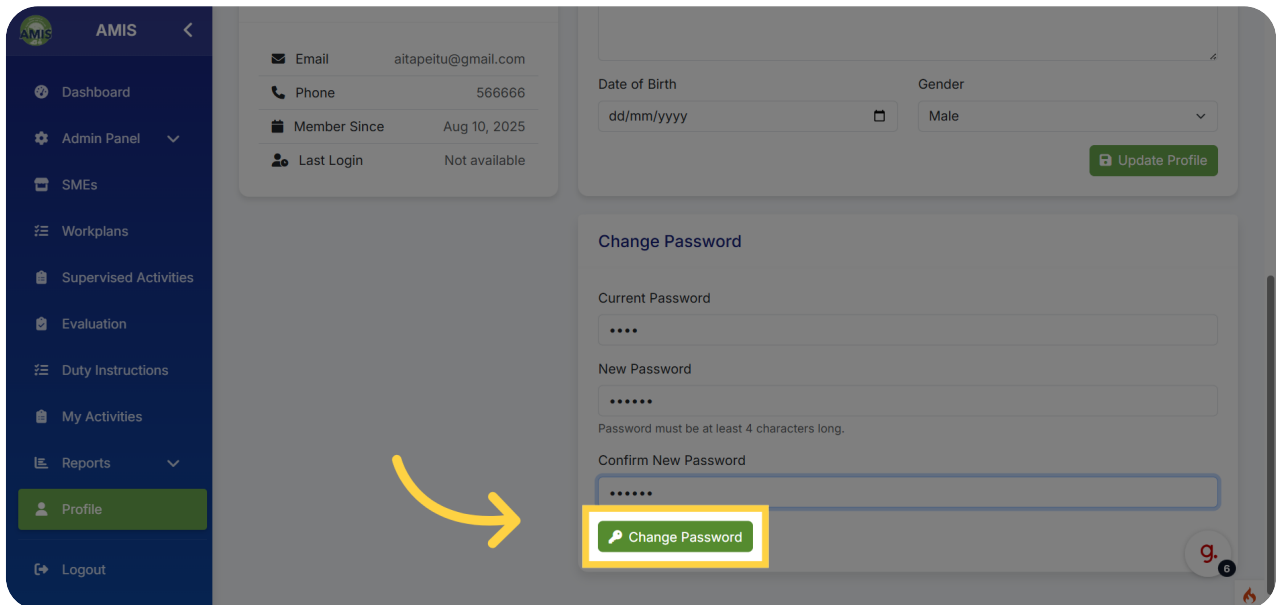
Type in the new password and confirm the new password.
